## tales of hope Jocelan's story

Hi, my name is Jocelan, and I'm 42 years old. I grew up with my mom, dad and my older sister in an alcoholic home. My dad was the drinker. My early life consisted of many types of abuse, some in the home and some outside of the home. I struggled in school and was diagnosed with ADHD. It was fairly new and treatment was even newer. I slipped through the cracks. I had no idea why I was so lost in school and was ashamed to admit it. I found it easier to mask my selfhatred and low self-worth by acting out, skipping class and fighting. Eventually, I was kicked out of high school and was not welcome at any public school. My coping mechanisms extended beyond my behaviour at school. I also struggled with bulimia and anorexia and spent time in the hospital for it. I continued to search for solutions outside myself: shopping, overworking, and relationships. By the time I was 23, I was married and had three children. I was struggling—I felt so alone and unsupported, and the trauma of my childhood had followed me. I started using drugs at the age of 25, and by the time I was 26, I had lost everything because of my addiction: my marriage, my kids, my home. I went in and out of recovery, but with each relapse, I sunk further and further. I eventually ended up with criminal charges for crimes I had committed to support my habit. I was lucky enough to have been accepted into Drug Court. Instead of serving your sentence in jail, Drug Court allows you to serve your sentence in the community through programs like detoxification, addiction and recovery programs, therapy, etc.

This is how I found myself walking through the doors of Adeara. I spent 16 months there, learning how to manage my emotions, deal with triggers, and received intense trauma therapy. Adeara is also where I found Christ. My life changed dramatically in so many ways. Through Him, I was able to restore a relationship with my children and with my family. Adeara didn't only save my life: it changed it fully. I have since graduated from Drug Court and had "My life changed dramatically in so many ways. the support of Adeara right to the end. I have been able to take and pass my GED. Through my GED, I received diagnoses of other conditions that affect my learning. This has made it easier for me to pursue my education at Vanguard and obtain my degree in theology, pastoral care and counseling. I have also had the wonderful opportunity to become a part of the Adeara staff team, where I can give back to Adeara and the community. I can honestly say that today life is good, and I look forward to what tomorrow brings. I know that I am never alone, and through Christ who strengthens me, I can do all things.

## **A Third More Than A Fad Thrift Store Location**

Just over a year ago, we opened our first thrift store location: More Than a Fad Southside. Since then, we've seen the need and the opportunity to grow beyond that original location, and the doors have opened. (Okay, we may have charged through some of them.) This summer, we opened our second location in Kingsway, and this fall, only a few months later, we opened our third location at Westpoint. To say the least, this has been quite the journey! We are so grateful for the distance we've come.

#### The new location

Where is Westpoint, you ask? Our third thrift store is located on 170th Street and 100th Avenue next to the old Cheesecake Factory. It boasts bright wall-to-wall windows on three fronts, a spacious layout, and two change rooms! Currently, it is not accepting item donations, but that may change in the near future. Stay tuned.

We've found that each of the three stores is unique, and we love the natural, boutique feeling that Westpoint fosters. This store is special for another reason too - we've



introduced a new pricing and tagging system, which makes it easier for customers to read the prices on the tags and it helps our volunteers check out items more quickly. This system will be rolling out to our Kingsway and Southside locations in the new year.
